

### Visualisation



Our whole school has been focusing on the reading comprehension strategy of visualisation. In the Year 3/4/5 class we have been learning about how visualisation can help us understand what we read. Visualisation is about picturing an image in your head when you read a piece of writing.

If you're reading a book and then see the movie it won't be the same because you think differently than the producer, your visualisations will be different and that's okay, everyone is different. You need to make sure your writing is clear and easy to follow so that the reader can picture images in their head. Adding details and description into our writing is important as it helps the reader make a clearer picture in their mind.

We each created detailed paragraphs about stories from our weekend, a time from our life or from our imagination. After we had written these paragraphs we handed them to other students and then they drew what they visualised in their heads when reading our writing.
