




Pupil Free Day

Illawonga camp








'I had fun driving the boat and we got to see lots of birds.' **Logan**

On the last day of camp we went to the Big Bend Lookout.


Our bus went on the Ferry to get to Swan Reach. We went on a scavenger hunt at the Museum.
