

Local Education Team Visit

Neil White - Education Director and Michelle Barnes - Curriculum Lead visited classes to do an observation of our Site Improvement goals in action. To start the day they joined in with the 6/7 Morning Circle. They observed the literacy block in the R/1/2 class to see synthetic phonics in action. They moved into the 3/4/5 class to see Procedural writing and recalling facts and finished in the 6/7 class observing students using the STAR problem solving model. The visit was followed up with detailed observation notes and discussions with staff about where to next.

We will remember them.










PLAT Recycling Workshop

We added manure.




Wet layer.






"We answered the question 'What do you have for lunch today? and made columns. In our class, it is most likely that on Friday you have a lunch order." – Paul


