



"When we made our box it was strong and we had a parachute so Eggbert was safe." - Peter




"I like that Eggbert shattered in half but that was nasty." – Xavier

"I found out that crumple zones can be very useful. I also noticed that our egg broke because it came out of the device and smashed from the impact." – Alex







Be with people who make you feel good




