FRICTION

What is Friction??

When something is grippy like the bottom of your shoe it has high friction. - Sid

It is when two surfaces are in contact with one another. If it has bumps or grip it goes slower, if it is smooth it goes fast, sometimes too fast like when your grip wears down on your shoes. – Paul




Experiment

We tested the friction of different surfaces by putting different materials on a ramp and then we held a car at the top to the ramp by its tow ball and let it go by itself, we did not push it. We measured how far the car rolled for each surface with a ruler.

In the experiment we had to keep everything the same except the ramp surfaces because that was our independent variable. Things that we had to keep the same were the slope of the ramp, the car that we used, the surface it rolled onto, the wind.




Prediction

I thought that the car would go furthest on bubble wrap because I thought the bubbles would make it go faster, but it didn't go very far.

Results

The flatter, smoother things made the car go the biggest distance like the cardboard calendar and the Back of the Duplo plate.

The bumpy things had high friction and the car didn't roll very far, like the bath mat. – Sid







Year 3/4

DRONE

This term we have been learning about drones in STEM. We learned about the programs we had to use to fly the drones using the iPads. The program was called Tello. We worked in groups of three. We used mission pads to program our drones to move in a square from mission pad 1 to 4. We then all had a race to see which group had the quickest drone, we thought this was lots of fun! We have had to create an overview of our pretend farm and each group made an obstacle course to fly their drones through. The course could use things such as pool noodles, table, chairs, buckets, skipping ropes and hula hoops. The hula hoops and the pool noodles were hanging on the roof. On Tuesday, 24th September we had a visit to our school from WSB, they bought in their drone and demonstrated it to us.


"Tap! Tap!" Went the racquets. Me and Harry from Koolunga won most of our games except for one but it was fun going to Hot Shots." - DJ
















There were six activities - leap of faith! giant swing, high ropes, low ropes, archery, initiatives. The ones I am writing about are low ropes and giant swings!


